The study day « Hungarian Cinema: The End of a Century? Histories, Sociologies, Aesthetics (first session: 1980-2000) » introduces a long-run research program, articulating academic events and publications, aiming at developing and federating scholars' works related to contemporary Hungarian cinema. This program aims to question the idea of the historical turn of 1989 as an abrupt one, and to study the way(s) that directors and their crews in fact anticipated and confronted this. As a result, a significant section of it will be concerned with approaches of art history and art sociology, in order to understand the modalities of the transition from the 1980s to the 1990s. Additionally, the conference will ascertain what this specific atmosphere both « end of time » and « end of history » generated in terms of mutations and aesthetic inventions.
